This Week's Focus

Phonics- This week students focused on words that contain the schwa sound. This is actually the most common vowel sound in the English language and can disguise itself using any of the five vowels.

Reading- This week the class finished note taking on the different characteristics of drama. We compared acts in plays to chapters in stories and scenes in plays to paragraphs in stories. The students then practiced their acting skills in a reader's theater rendition of the popular book, "The Stinky Cheese Man."

Writing- We started our new writing unit about informational writing this week. We discussed the differences between personal narratives and informational writing and then read research reports about Jamaica, Time Tebow, and Manatees. Ask your child to name one other example of informational writing other than a research report.

Spelling- The focuses of this week's spelling unit are words with the schwa ('uh') sound. The regular list and challenge list were used again for this unit.

Math- This week students took the pre-test for Chapter 7 which focuses on the operations of multiplication and division. We will be focusing mostly on the division lessons in the chapter as students have shown a great grasp on multiplication. It would greatly benefit your child to be logging into Moby Max and practicing Fact Fluency throughout the week. If you have any questions about your child's login information or this wonderful online resource, please do not hesitate to reach out to me!

Religion- This week the class focused on the Two Great Commandments which Jesus used to summarize the Ten Commandments. We read three popular bible stories to help us understand how to live out these Two Great Commandments in our daily lives.

Science- The class will now be focusing on Science in the third quarter starting with our Life Cycle Unit. This week students learned about the life cycle of flowering plants and the important role that seeds and spores play in a plant's life cycle.
