This Week's Focus

March 22. 2019

Phonics- This week students continued to review common syllable patterns.

Reading- We continued in our three reading groups this week and students completed an activity about illustrations. In this activity students looked at a picture of an old house and wrote three feelings or thoughts that they got from the picture. Then, students read a passage about the house and compared any additional feelings and thoughts they got from the passage to the feelings and thoughts they got from the picture alone. We discussed that illustrations can add to passages by furthering our reading comprehension and deepening our thoughts and feelings about any given written text.

Writing- This week students began writing a poem about themselves to tie into our informational writing unit. Students defined biographies and then filled out a poem template using words to describe what they loved, dreamed of, were afraid of, etc. Each student is in the publishing process of this poem.

Spelling- This week students received a review spelling list. This list contains previous list words from the past three units. The spelling patterns being tested on this review unit are r-controlled vowels and homophones.

Math-This week students continued work in Chapter 9. We learned the difference between an equation and an expression. We also evaluated expressions by plugging a number in for a given variable. Ask your child to explain to you the main difference between an expression and an equation.

Religion- This week we reviewed the parable of The Good Samaritan. We discussed how this parable is an example for us for on how to live out The Second Great Commandment, and how Jesus is our Good Samaritan because he always shows love to us and saves us from sin and death.

Science- This week we learned about severe weather and why severe weather can be so dangerous. Ask your child how they can stay safe and prepare for severe weather at home.
