# This Week's Focus

April 12, 2019

Phonics- This week students reviewed words with double consonants.

Reading- As we have been continuing in our reading groups, I have been so impressed with the way that the groups are working with each other. The conversations we have been able to have are always thought provoking and go deeper than just the plot of the story. Thank you for your support of our book groups outside of the classroom and for working with your children on completing required readings and packet questions. This has really helped the success of our reading group sessions each week!

Writing- This week we learned how to write concluding paragraphs that appropriately end our research reports. We discussed that concluding paragraphs do not introduce any new information and that they restate what was written in the introductory paragraph. We also talked about using expert words in our reports instead of boring words. Ask your child to name you one expert word they decided to use in their report.

Spelling- This week students started Spelling Unit 25 which focusses on words with double consonants. A challenge list and regular list were used again this week.

Math-This week students started work in Chapter 10 which focuses on fractions. Students distinguished the difference between the numerator and denominator and used fraction circle manipulatives to better understand how to write a unit fraction, or only one part of a whole. Ask your child what makes a unit fraction different than a fraction.

Although we have completed our math book chapters that focus on multiplication and division we are still working on our math facts every day at school. It would greatly benefit your child's math fact automaticity to be working on Moby Max Fact Fluency at home. This will help ensure that your child is prepared for the more complex multiplication and division problems they will be working with in fourth grade.

Religion- This week we learned the three essential elements, Sacraments, teachings, and hierarchy, that define the Catholic Church. Ask your child to explain to you how these three elements are similar to a peanut butter and jelly sandwich.

Social Studies- This week we continued to discuss suburban, rural, and urban communities. We reviewed the three communities we visited in The United States and even traveled across the world to Tokyo, Japan. Ask your child to explain to you how Tokyo and Chicago are similar.
