This Week's Focus

Phonics- This week students reviewed words that have inflected endings -ed, -ing, -er, and -est. Ask your child what the rule is for adding these inflected endings when the base word ends with the letter y.

Reading- Students started to take notes on comparing and contrasting in their reading interactive notebooks this week. We discussed how a Venn Diagram is an effective tool when trying to compare and contrast, and even carried this knowledge over into Social Studies where we compared and contrasted ourselves to Native American children from early Michigan using a Venn Diagram.

In addition to this, our last book study of the year was announced this Friday! Check your email and your child's Friday folder for more information on this book and how we will conduct reading groups with this new book.

Writing- This week almost every student finished publishing their planet reports and we started to present our reports to the class! We will be starting our next writing unit of study next week which will focus on opinion and persuasive essays.

Just a reminder that Step 4, the final draft, is due Wednesday of next week (May 8th) and Step 5, the visual collage, is due Thursday of next week (May 9th). Students will be presenting both their written reports and their visuals to the class starting Friday (May 10th).

Spelling- The Unit 28 Spelling topics are adding the suffixes -ed and -ing and doubling the final consonant when adding any suffix. Challenge and regular lists were both used for this unit.

Math- This week students started Chapter 11 which focusses on measurement. Students distinguished the difference between a milliliter and a liter and a gram and a kilogram. We also completed an investigation where students had to guess if a container would hold less than, more than, or about one liter of water. After students made guesses for all of the different containers, we measured out one liter of water to test if their guesses were correct or incorrect. Ask your child what every day object has the capacity of about one liter.

Religion- This week we focused on the resurrection of Jesus and how this is the most important fact of our Christian faith. I am so proud of the third grade class for the reverence and responsibility they showed leading the last mass the Third Grade class is in charge of leading for the year! What a wonderful year of masses we have had!

Social Studies- This week we finished Ch. 3 and will start Ch. 4 next week where students will learn all about the French fur trade.
