### This Week's Focus

**Phonics**- This week students reviewed contractions and the two words that make up contractions.

Reading- Students continued their study of comparing and contrasting this week. We looked at a reading passage that compared the first Olympics to the Olympics we have today. Students were surprised to learn that the Olympics started in Greece and the grand prize for first place was not a medal, but instead a crown made of olive leaves.

In addition to this, we started Because of Winn-Dixie this week. The class has read chapters 1-4 and is eager to read more! Ask your child to describe to you how Opal's new dog got his strange name.

**Writing-** This week every student finished his or her planet research report and presented it to the class. We will be starting our last writing unit of study next week. This unit will focus on persuasive essays and opinion writing.

I loved reading every student's biography interview reports this week! There are so many special people in your children's lives and I know it was so meaningful for them to be able to share just a glimpse of these remarkable lives with their classmates!

**Spelling**- The Unit 29 Spelling topic is contractions. On the test, students will have to write both the contraction and the two words that make up the contraction. Challenge and regular lists were both used for this unit.

**Math**-This week students continued work in Chapter 11 which focusses on measurement. Students distinguished the difference between a kilogram and a gram and then solved word problems using these two units of mass. Ask your child what item used for organizing papers has a mass close to one gram.

Religion- This week we focused on Jesus as the Paschal Lamb. We compared the sacrifice of Jesus to the sacrifice of the unblemished lamb on Passover. I was so impressed with all of the connections that the class was able to come up with regarding The Passover Lamb and Jesus. I told the students that they were all mini theologians this week!
