## This Week's Focus

**Phonics**- This week students focused on words with the long *e* sound spelled *ee* and *ea*. Ask your child why we refer to these words as 'sweet treat' words.

**Reading-** This week the class started to take notes on character, character traits, and character motivation. Ask your child to explain the difference between characterization and character traits. We also started *The BFG* as a class read aloud during snack.

Writing- This week students continued to work on adding dialogue to their own personal narratives. We worked on adding and properly punctuating 'tags' at the beginning and at the end of dialogue. In addition to this, the class worked on adding small details to their personal narratives.

**Spelling**- The focus of Spelling Unit 9 is the long *e* sound spelled *ee* and *ea*. Both the challenge and regular list were used this week.

**Math**- This week students started working in Chapter 3 which focusses on the operation of subtraction. Students broke apart large numbers to aid in mental subtraction, rounded to help estimate the difference, and completed three and four-digit subtraction problems.

**Religion-** This week the class started Unit 2 of our new religion series. This week we focused on the parables that Jesus told his disciples. We compared the parables Jesus told to fables that we are familiar with today.

**Social Studies-** The class started our first Social Studies unit this week all about Michigan. We looked at important people in Michigan's history including Tunis Ponsen and James A. McDivitt and we discussed many reasons why Michigan is such a special state.

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
